

Framed and matted to measure 30x40", the piece is signed by Manning above his likeness in flowing silver ink. Contemporary art has demonstrated strong investment merits as an alternative asset class. In owning this painting, collectors and investors stand to benefit from four major tailwinds simultaneously: continued appreciation of art as an asset class, sports art's rise to prominence within collecting circles, Manning's astounding achievements and legacy, and the prominence of Fiorentino as one of the greatest sports artists in the world.

Very few auction lots can say they changed the world, but this offering can make a strong claim as the product of the 21st Century. Sealed First Generation iPhones - the latest burgeoning vertical of collectible asset classes dabbles in historical significance as well as nostalgia. iPhones were never meant to be collected, they were designed to be used, and as such precious few were left in the original packaging either through immense foresight, resistance to change, or forgetfulness.

The offered Model A1203, Order MA712LL/A (8GB) first generation iPhone 1 is encased in the iTunes icon variant box (other printings have 12 icons visible on the screen, while this rendition adds a 13th - iTunes). Light handling and storage wear are present on the shrink-wrapped exterior of the box.

As with many other collectibles, a small detail can make a world of difference when it comes to pricing. In the case of the offered Pokémon Red sealed game it is a graphic on the back featuring Sandshew duking it out with Meowth that denotes this particular issuance as "early-production" - and thus more coveted. One of two at the WATA 9.2 A grade level with 26 higher, out of 64 total graded copies. The first installment of the Pokémon game series, alongside Pokémon Blue, allowed players to catch up to 139 creatures. The 'cover monster' on Red, Charizard - possibly the most popular character in the universe - gives this version of the game a slight boost on the secondary market over the Blastoise-featuring Blue.

The game became a "cultural touchstone" according to GamesRadar, who ranked it as the #12 best game of all-time in 2021. The offered copy is one of 15 at the 9.6 A+ grade level with only ten grading higher out of nearly 200 examples.

Asset combines excellence in athletics, fashion, and pop culture relevance - and comes to market just in time for the release of "Air", a biopic starring Matt Damon and Ben Affleck as Nike haymakers Sonny Vaccaro and Phil Knight.

Sneakers are a mismatched pair with the left sneaker is heavily worn and has "850608 TY" stamp, while the unsigned right sneaker is in better condition with "850406 TY1." Signatured is certified by Upper Deck Authenticated and is accompanied by a Certificate of Authenticity.



Cardboard Connection stated, in their guide to Matthews' rookie cards, that this issue is "the Auston Matthews rookie card to own if your budget allows it. The ultra premium brand has no match among NHL cards."

Fueled by Jordan's unmatched accolades on the court as well as the popularity of ESPN's "The Last Dance" documentary that brought "a new generation [to] the Church of Jordan as devout adherents" - per Heritage Auctions. With PSA calling it the "most recognizable basketball card and the most important modern card from any sport in the entire hobby."

More than 13,000 examples have been graded by PSA with 620 at the Mint level and just 23 higher.

Graded Near Mint 7 by PSA. "The Big Dipper" is unquestionably one of the greatest basketball players to ever play - a legacy that only seems to get stronger over time. Said Heritage Auctions, "[Chamberlain's] rookie card is arguably one of the top two most important cards in the basketball hobby."



Hailing from that '58 season is the offered Topps card, #150 in the set featuring a prime Mick upon a bold orange background. Graded

an SGC NM-MT+ 8.5 only a single example - a Mint 9 - can be found in a higher SGC grade, with six equaling the condition of this beauty.



Roger Maris' remarkable accolades were brought to the forefront of baseball fan's minds for the second half of the 2022 Major League Baseball season as Aaron Judge chased (and eventually caught and surpassed) the American League single season home run record of 61 that Maris had set more than six decades ago. This stunning offering is one of just 35 PSA Mint copies of Maris' 1958 Topps rookie card, with none of the nearly 6,000 encapsulated examples grading higher.

Considered one of the most visually captivating cards ever made and the clear rookie card of Sandy Koufax to own.

Featuring a youthful but deceptively innocent-looking Koufax, the card is renowned for its popularity as one of the key assets in an iconic 1955 Topps baseball set. Just shy of 10,000 examples of the '55 Topps Kofuax have been submitted to PSA with just 45 cards graded higher in circulation. Koufax's portrait has been described as "unassuming and near-perfect, much like the pitcher was on the mound." The offering has been awarded a PWCC-A sticker for eye appeal.




Willie Mays offers a scare early-career of the "Say Hey! Kid."

An article from PSA quoting collector Joe Gehardi states, "Once people start realizing how rare it is, I think [the 1952 Berk Ross set] is going to grow in popularity and hopefully increase in price, as well." Graded a PSA Mint 9 it is one of only six at that level with none rating higher - much rarer than the iconic '52 Topps issue, which has more than 2,600 total copies graded.

Simply an iconic offering, this 1948 Leaf is the only true rookie card for American legend, Jackie Robinson. In fact,

some collectors view this card as the single most important rookie card in the hobby, period. A stark example of "buy the card, not the grade", this PSA 3.5 example's eye appeal surpasses that of many PSA 6s, affording it the PWCC-E sticker (Top 15%). Jackie Robinson's collectibles prices continue to soar and, given his historical and cultural significance, he'll likely remain one of the most investable athletes of all time.

1948 BOWMAN MIKAN ROOKIE

A vintage staple, this is a classic card of basketball's first marquee player, George Mikan. Mikan is more responsible than any player of his generation for making basketball a nationally recognized sport. Graded a PSA 7, there are 41 PSA 7s in existence, with only 28 examples graded higher known to exist. Dubbed "Mr. Basketball" and voted the best "basketball player of the half century" in a 1950 Associated Press poll, Mikan was so dominant a player that he revolutionized the game's rules, from the introduction of the shot clock to goaltending. Deserving of an allocation in any basketball collectors' portfolio.



Given his proclivities as a willing signer, it is important to note that only 15 examples of this card have been authenticated and encapsulated by PSA. Addressed and inscribed "To Cullen, Best Wishes." The simplistic black and white design of this card adds to its charm and has established itself as one of the most significant "Teddy Ballgame" collectible items out there.

Card grades technically as PR due to creasing, soiling, and damage to the reverse with a faded "Ted Williams" notation on the lower front border. Encapsulated by PSA/DNA. Authentic.

The size and distribution method of this Exhibit issue have left most examples worn around the edges. Though this particular copy, graded a PSA GD 2, displays well nearly a century after its printing.

The all-time leader in career batting average is shown in his 'Bat on Shoulder' pose with a Piedmont 150 back. Graded a PSA EX 5, it is one of nine at the grade level with just seven higher.
